## SENATE BILL 6775

## AS AMENDED BY THE HOUSE

Passed Legislature - 2000 Regular Session

State of Washington 56th Legislature 2000 Regular Session

**By** Senators Patterson, Horn, Haugen, Shin, Prentice, Goings, Gardner and Costa

Read first time 01/26/2000. Referred to Committee on State & Local Government.

AN ACT Relating to filing of reports with the public disclosure commission; amending RCW 42.17.065, 42.17.080, 42.17.369, 42.17.3691, and 42.17.461; and adding a new section to chapter 42.17 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 42.17.065 and 1989 c 280 s 5 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 (1) In addition to the provisions of this section, a continuing 8 political committee shall file and report on the same conditions and at 9 the same times as any other committee in accordance with the provisions 10 of RCW 42.17.040, 42.17.050, and 42.17.060.

(2) A continuing political committee shall file with the commission 11 and the auditor or elections officer of the county in which the 12 13 committee maintains its office or headquarters and if there is no such 14 office or headquarters then in the county in which the committee 15 treasurer resides a report on the tenth day of the month detailing its activities for the preceding calendar month in which the committee has 16 17 received a contribution or made an expenditure: PROVIDED, That such report shall only be filed if either the total contributions received 18 19 or total expenditures made since the last such report exceed two

hundred dollars: PROVIDED FURTHER, That after January 1, 2002, if the committee files with the commission electronically, it need not also file with the county auditor or elections officer. The report shall be on a form supplied by the commission and shall include the following information:

(a) The information required by RCW 42.17.090;

7 (b) Each expenditure made to retire previously accumulated debts of
8 the committee; identified by recipient, amount, and date of payments;
9 (c) Such other information as the commission shall by rule
10 prescribe.

(3) If a continuing political committee shall make a contribution in support of or in opposition to a candidate or ballot proposition within sixty days prior to the date on which such candidate or ballot proposition will be voted upon, such continuing political committee shall report pursuant to RCW 42.17.080.

16 (4) A continuing political committee shall file reports as required 17 by this chapter until it is dissolved, at which time a final report 18 shall be filed. Upon submitting a final report, the duties of the 19 campaign treasurer shall cease and there shall be no obligation to make 20 any further reports.

The campaign treasurer shall maintain books of account 21 (5) accurately reflecting all contributions and expenditures on a current 22 basis within five business days of receipt or expenditure. During the 23 24 eight days immediately preceding the date of any election, for which 25 the committee has received any contributions or made any expenditures, 26 the books of account shall be kept current within one business day and 27 shall be open for public inspection ((for at least two consecutive hours Monday through Friday, excluding legal holidays, between 8:00 28 29 a.m. and 8:00 p.m., as specified in the committee's statement of 30 organization filed pursuant to RCW 42.17.040, at the principal campaign headquarters or, if there is no campaign headquarters, at the address 31 of the campaign treasurer or such other place as may be authorized by 32 the commission)) in the same manner as provided for candidates and 33 34 other political committees in RCW 42.17.080(5).

(6) All reports filed pursuant to this section shall be certifiedas correct by the campaign treasurer.

(7) The campaign treasurer shall preserve books of account, bills,receipts, and all other financial records of the campaign or political

committee for not less than five calendar years following the year 1 2 during which the transaction occurred.

3 Sec. 2. RCW 42.17.080 and 1999 c 401 s 13 are each amended to read 4 as follows:

5 (1) On the day the treasurer is designated, each candidate or political committee shall file with the commission and the county 6 7 auditor or elections officer of the county in which the candidate resides, or in the case of a political committee, the county in which 8 9 the treasurer resides, in addition to any statement of organization 10 required under RCW 42.17.040 or 42.17.050, a report of all contributions received and expenditures made prior to that date, if 11 12 any.

(2) At the following intervals each treasurer shall file with the 13 14 commission and the county auditor or elections officer of the county in 15 which the candidate resides, or in the case of a political committee, 16 the county in which the committee maintains its office or headquarters, and if there is no office or headquarters then in the county in which 17 18 the treasurer resides, a report containing the information required by RCW 42.17.090: 19

(a) On the twenty-first day and the seventh day immediately 20 preceding the date on which the election is held; and 21

22 (b) On the tenth day of the first month after the election: 23 PROVIDED, That this report shall not be required following a primary 24 election from:

25 (i) A candidate whose name will appear on the subsequent general election ballot; or 26

27

(ii) Any continuing political committee; and

(c) On the tenth day of each month in which no other reports are 28 29 required to be filed under this section: PROVIDED, That such report 30 shall only be filed if the committee has received a contribution or made an expenditure in the preceding calendar month and either the 31 total contributions received or total expenditures made since the last 32 such report exceed two hundred dollars. 33

34 When there is no outstanding debt or obligation, and the campaign fund is closed, and the campaign is concluded in all respects, and in 35 36 the case of a political committee, the committee has ceased to function 37 and has dissolved, the treasurer shall file a final report. Upon

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submitting a final report, the duties of the treasurer shall cease and
 there shall be no obligation to make any further reports.

3 The report filed twenty-one days before the election shall report 4 all contributions received and expenditures made as of the end of the fifth business day before the date of the report. The report filed 5 seven days before the election shall report all contributions received 6 7 and expenditures made as of the end of the one business day before the 8 date of the report. Reports filed on the tenth day of the month shall 9 report all contributions received and expenditures made from the 10 closing date of the last report filed through the last day of the month preceding the date of the current report. 11

(3) For the period beginning the first day of the fourth month 12 13 preceding the date on which the special or general election is held and ending on the date of that election, each Friday the treasurer shall 14 15 file with the commission and the appropriate county elections officer 16 a report of each bank deposit made during the previous seven calendar 17 The report shall contain the name of each person contributing days. the funds so deposited and the amount contributed by each person. 18 19 However, contributions of no more than twenty-five dollars in the 20 aggregate from any one person may be deposited without identifying the contributor. A copy of the report shall be retained by the treasurer 21 for his or her records. In the event of deposits made by a deputy 22 treasurer, the copy shall be forwarded to the treasurer for his or her 23 24 records. Each report shall be certified as correct by the treasurer or 25 deputy treasurer making the deposit.

26 (4) If a city requires that candidates or committees for city 27 offices file reports with a city agency, the candidate or treasurer so 28 filing need not also file the report with the county auditor or 29 elections officer.

30 (5) The treasurer or candidate shall maintain books of account 31 accurately reflecting all contributions and expenditures on a current 32 basis within five business days of receipt or expenditure. During the 33 eight days immediately preceding the date of the election the books of 34 account shall be kept current within one business day. As specified in 35 the committee's statement of organization filed under RCW 42.17.040, 36 the books of account must be open for public inspection as follows:

37 (a) For at least two consecutive hours <u>between 8:00 a.m. and 8:00</u>
 38 <u>p.m.</u> on the eighth day immediately before the election, ((between 8:00
 39 a.m. and 8:00 p.m., as specified in the committee's statement of

1 organization filed pursuant to RCW 42.17.040)) except when it is a
2 legal holiday, in which case on the seventh day immediately before the
3 election, at the principal headquarters or, if there is no
4 headquarters, at the address of the treasurer or such other place as
5 may be authorized by the commission; and

б (b) By appointment for inspections to be conducted at the 7 designated place for inspections between 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. on any 8 other day from the seventh day through the day immediately before the 9 election, other than Saturday, Sunday, or a legal holiday. It is a 10 violation of this chapter for a candidate or political committee to refuse to allow and keep an appointment for an inspection to be 11 conducted during these authorized times and days in the week prior to 12 the election. The appointment must be allowed at an authorized time 13 and day for such inspections that is within twenty-four hours of the 14 time and day that is requested for the inspection. 15

16 (((5))) (6) The treasurer or candidate shall preserve books of 17 account, bills, receipts, and all other financial records of the 18 campaign or political committee for not less than five calendar years 19 following the year during which the transaction occurred.

20 (((6))) (7) All reports filed pursuant to subsection((s)) (1) or 21 (2) of this section shall be certified as correct by the candidate and 22 the treasurer.

(((7))) (8) Copies of all reports filed pursuant to this section 23 24 shall be readily available for public inspection for at least two 25 consecutive hours Monday through Friday, excluding legal holidays, 26 between 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m., as specified in the committee's 27 statement of organization filed pursuant to RCW 42.17.040, at the principal headquarters or, if there is no headquarters, at the address 28 29 of the treasurer or such other place as may be authorized by the 30 commission.

31 (((<del>8)</del>)) (<u>9</u>) After January 1, 2002, a report that is filed with the 32 commission electronically need not also be filed with the county 33 auditor or elections officer.

34 <u>(10)</u> The commission shall adopt administrative rules establishing 35 requirements for filer participation in any system designed and 36 implemented by the commission for the electronic filing of reports.

37 **Sec. 3.** RCW 42.17.369 and 1999 c 401 s 11 are each amended to read 38 as follows:

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(1) By July 1, 1999, the commission shall ((offer every)) make available to candidates, public officials, and political committees((7 and party organization)) that ((is)) are required to file reports under this chapter ((the option of filing)) an electronic filing alternative for submitting financial affairs reports, contribution reports, and expenditure reports ((electronically)), including but not limited to filing by diskette ((or via)), modem, satellite, or the Internet.

8 (2) By January 1, ((2001)) 2002, the commission shall ((offer all)) 9 make available to lobbyists and lobbyists' employers required to file 10 reports under RCW 42.17.150, 42.17.170, 42.17.175, or 42.17.180 ((the 11 option of filing)) an electronic filing alternative for submitting 12 these reports ((electronically)) including but not limited to filing by 13 diskette ((or via)), modem, satellite, or the Internet.

(3) The commission shall make available to ((each)) candidates,
public officials, political committees, lobbyists, and lobbyists'
employers((, and party organization)) an electronic copy of the
appropriate reporting forms at no charge.

18 **Sec. 4.** RCW 42.17.3691 and 1999 c 401 s 12 are each amended to 19 read as follows:

(1) Beginning January 1, ((2001)) 2002, each ((continuing)) 20 <u>candidate or</u> political committee((,)) that expended ((ten)) <u>twenty-five</u> 21 22 thousand dollars or more in the preceding year or expects to expend 23 ((ten)) twenty-five thousand dollars or more ((in expenditures)) in the 24 current year((-)) shall file all contribution reports and expenditure 25 reports required by this chapter ((electronically by diskette or via modem, satellite, or the Internet)) by the electronic alternative 26 provided by the commission under RCW 42.17.369. The commission may 27 make exceptions on a case-by-case basis for candidates whose authorized 28 29 committees lack the technological ability to file reports using the 30 electronic alternative provided by the commission.

31 (2) Beginning January 1, 2004, each candidate or political 32 committee that expended ten thousand dollars or more in the preceding 33 year or expects to expend ten thousand dollars or more in the current 34 year shall file all contribution reports and expenditure reports 35 required by this chapter by the electronic alternative provided by the 36 commission under RCW 42.17.369. The commission may make exceptions on 37 a case-by-case basis for candidates whose authorized committees lack 1 <u>the technological ability to file reports using the electronic</u> 2 <u>alternative provided by the commission.</u>

3 (3) Failure by a ((continuing)) candidate or political committee 4 to comply with this section is a violation of this chapter.

5 **Sec. 5.** RCW 42.17.461 and 1999 c 401 s 2 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 (1) The commission shall establish goals that all reports, copies
8 of reports, or copies of the data or information included in reports,
9 filed under RCW 42.17.040, 42.17.065, 42.17.080, 42.17.100, 42.17.105,
10 42.17.150, 42.17.170, 42.17.175, and 42.17.180, that are:

(a) Submitted using the commission's electronic filing system shall be accessible in the commission's office within two business days of the commission's receipt of the report and shall be accessible on the commission's web site within seven business days of the commission's receipt of the report; and

(b) Submitted in any format or using any method other than as 16 described in (a) of this subsection, shall be accessible in the 17 18 commission's office within four business days of the actual physical 19 receipt of the report, and not the technical date of filing as provided under RCW 42.17.420, and shall be accessible on the commission's web 20 site within fourteen business days of the actual physical receipt of 21 22 the report, and not the technical date of filing as provided under RCW 23 42.17.420, as specified in rule adopted by the commission.

(2) On January 1, 2001, or shortly thereafter, the commission shall
revise these goals to reflect that all reports, copies of reports, or
copies of the data or information included in reports, filed under RCW
42.17.040, 42.17.065, 42.17.080, 42.17.100, 42.17.105, 42.17.150,
42.17.170, 42.17.175, and 42.17.180, that are:

(a) Submitted using the commission's electronic filing system shall be accessible in the commission's office within two business days of the commission's receipt of the report and on the commission's web site within ((two)) four business days of the commission's receipt of the report; and

(b) Submitted in any format or using any method other than as described in (a) of this subsection, shall be accessible in the commission's office within four business days of the actual physical <u>receipt of the report, and not the technical date of filing as provided</u> <u>under RCW 42.17.420</u>, and on the commission's web site within ((four))

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1 <u>seven</u> business days of the actual physical receipt of the report, and 2 not the technical date of filing as provided under RCW 42.17.420, as 3 specified in rule adopted by the commission.

(3) On January 1, 2002, or shortly thereafter, the commission shall
revise these goals to reflect that all reports, copies of reports, or
copies of the data or information included in reports, filed under RCW
42.17.040, 42.17.065, 42.17.080, 42.17.100, 42.17.105, 42.17.150,
42.17.170, 42.17.175, and 42.17.180, that are:

9 <u>(a) Submitted using the commission's electronic filing system must</u> 10 <u>be accessible in the commission's office and on the commission's web</u> 11 <u>site within two business days of the commission's receipt of the</u> 12 <u>report; and</u>

(b) Submitted in any format or using any method other than as described in (a) of this subsection, must be accessible in the commission's office and on the commission's web site within four business days of the actual physical receipt of the report, and not the technical date of filing as provided under RCW 42.17.420, as specified in rule adopted by the commission.

19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 42.17 RCW 20 to read as follows:

In addition to its regular telephone number, the commission shall offer political committees and residents of this state the opportunity to contact the commission by a toll-free telephone number.
